

The Foundation Grant Program Assists With Front Page Issues


Poverty, homelessness, elder abuse, domestic violence, human trafficking, housing and workforce issues; all of these topics have been in the headlines this past year demonstrating the continued need to provide legal representation to the underserved and vulnerable people who cannot typically access legal services.

The legal challenges of the recipients encompass life-changing matters such as guardianships, bankruptcy, foreclosures, debt collection, and consumer debt.

Funding for the grants comes from contributions to The Foundation by lawyers, law firms, corporations and others. One hundred percent of their donations are awarded to beneficiary organizations, complementing the efforts of local organizations and positively impacting the lives of many in New York State. The ripple effect of the program is significant as many of our grantees work with organizations in neighboring counties to provide an extensive reach of services.

As the charitable and philanthropic entity of the New York State Bar Association, The Foundation makes grants in four major areas including: increasing public understanding of the law; improving the justice system and the law; facilitating the delivery of legal services; and enhancing professional competence and ethics.

Through the diligent work of the Grant Review Committee and The Foundation Board of Directors, in 2014 sixty-seven grants were presented to non-profit organizations that provide legal services across New York State totaling \$392,500.

Your gifts change lives

Reports show that New York has been receiving an influx of undocumented immigrantyouth who are fleeing to the United States for a variety of heart-wrenching reasons: to escape gang violence, hunger, poverty and sexual brutality. Without a green card, these children struggle to find employment, cannot receive financial aid to attend college and may participate in illegal activities as a means to get by financially.

The Door, one of the recipients of a Foundation grant, received funding for its Legal Services for Undocumented Immigrant Youth project to provide critical support, advice, and counsel to undocumented immigrant youth through the Legal Services Center.

Meet Martin

Martin came to the United States from Haiti when he was 15, having just survived the 2010 earthquake. Alone and undocumented, he ended up in an abusive household where the threat of deportation loomed and he was constantly afraid. Eventually he ran away.

Fortunately he was enrolled at Broome Street Academy (BSA), a charter high school partnered with and co-located at The Door. Staff immediately connected Martin to The Door's Runaway and Homeless Youth team to make sure he had food, clothing and shelter, and to the Legal Center, where he could begin applying for a green card. More than that, The Door was there for him when no one else was: late one night, after being wrongfully arrested, Martin was shocked to see the director of the Legal Center coming to bail him out and bring him for immediate emergency foster care placement. "I just kept saying thank you, thank you, thank you, so many times," Martin recalls

Now a senior at BSA, Martin has recently obtained his green card and has his sights set on life after graduation. His advice for other undocumented youth: "Know that there's no reason to be scared. There are people who can help."

Your support provides opportunity

Start Small. Think Big. was also a grantee of The Foundation for its Small Business Legal Project. The project provides legal services and educational legal programming to small business owners with limited resources.

As the application noted, starting a business is a principal way for a select but significant number of low-income people to accumulate assets that give them a stake in society. Still, while small businesses are a pathway out of poverty for many, the risk of failure is high. One of the most significant challenges that lowincome entrepreneurs face is lack of affordable high-quality legal services. Jennifer DaSilva, Founder and Executive Director explains, "With critical support from The New York Bar Foundation, Start Small. Think Big.'s programming has grown exponentially over the last two years. The number of pro bono volunteers engaged increased 67% in 2013. The number of hours of pro bono services


provided increased 36%, and the value of those services increased a dramatic 173% (to almost \$3 million in 2013). Demand for our services continues to increase, in fact, applications for assistance are up 30%."

Meet Izaskun

Izaskun Zabala's name translates to "star in the hand"—quite fitting for this up-and-coming designer who creates beautiful, handmade jewelry at her Brooklyn studio. Following her heart and intuition, she's pursuing her dreams and taking on the challenges of a rapidly expanding small business with Start Small. Think Big.'s help. Over the course of the

last year Start Small and two teams of pro bono attorneys have helped Izaskun negotiate a non-disclosure agreement received from an interested buyer and assist with various entity formation and intellectual property matters. Izaskun's business is growing quickly and she is now in the process of hiring her first employee.

When asked how it feels to own her own business, Izaskun replied, "I get to use my own ideas and be creative while making an impact and difference in my neighborhood. I answer to my customers rather than a boss so it's easier to cater to my customers' needs; and I have flexibility, I get to make my own choices."

Make Something Big From Nothing

In this article, I propose to relate to the reader a glimpse of one large operation of The New York Bar Foundation and more specifically its Grant Review Committee

In 2013, I was named a Director of The Board of The Bar Foundation, ready to undertake its charitable endeavors. I was eager but not knowledgeable as to what lay ahead. In due course, I was tasked with service on the Grant Review Committee. Early in my service, other Board members described for me the nature of the voluminous grant applications and variations of their compelling content

In general, the Committee is besieged by applications submitted by highly worthy 501(c)(3) organizations, all seeking funds to benefit their specific benevolent missions.

Grant applications arrive to Committee members in sequence over a hundred at a time boxed and indexed and itemized. The process is manifestly competitive for hopeful applicants. Receipt of a grant from The Foundation is prestigious. Donors are kind, intelligent and sophisticated.

The initial screening and preliminary review of each individual application is undertaken by the Foundation's Director of Development and Administration, Deborah Auspelmyer. Each grant application is then assigned to an individual member of the Committee. That person carefully and comprehensively reviews the application. What do we look for? Maximum impact on a substantial group of people is very important. A demonstrated need for the intended service must exist. The grant applicant's development history, funding, and prior grant receipts from the Foundation are important.

If the facial screening criteria are met, each application is orally presented to the members of the Committee. Each member of the Committee is responsible for reviewing about ten grant applications per grant cycle and making an oral presentation with a specific recommendation. At the conclusion of the presentation members of the Committee discuss the application and ask wide ranging and explorative questions. The mission is discussed as well as maximizing impact on people, funding sources, and the funding recommendation of the reviewer. After discussion is complete the recommendation is voted upon. The outcome of the vote determines the recommendation of the Committee to the full Board of Directors.

The effort is intense

The work of the Committee is unique and challenging. Every grant application has merit. Each organization and the individuals served virtually always deserve funding. The dollars to be granted are precious and limited and therefore, the effort is at times intense.

Last year I was a freshman member. I was tasked to review an application focused within the Foundation's mission: Facilitating the Delivery of Legal Services. Seemingly this is an obvious and benign part of the Foundation's overall mission. Traditional natures of legal services provided to the poor immediately came to mind.

The grantee applicant was entirely unknown to me. I read the application. I applied the criteria. The application was quite distinct among well known applicants that do great work and receive funds. I found that the not-for-profit applicant organization was supported by 20 private law firms and that it annually delivers no less than \$3 million in pro bono services. The application was made on behalf of a business incubator for low income and limited resource entrepreneurs with its office located in an inner city. I found that 99% of all business establishments in inner city neighborhoods are small businesses and that 80% of the job base is from small business. The project, if funded, would facilitate over 20 legal workshops, serve close to 300 entrepreneurs, and 20 such clients with one-on-one legal services monthly. A grant from the Foundation had the potential to create opportunity and employment. I was con-

vinced of the merits and confident that I would recommend a grant.

I made my oral presentation to the Committee and it was well received. We voted to recommend funding the grant with \$10,000. My work was done.

Flash forward to my very first full Board of Directors meeting at which all Directors are present and the Committee's work is reviewed by the full Board for its final approval or disapproval. Prepared to vote, the question was called by the Chairwoman, and then a Director raised his hand with a specific inquiry concerning one particular grantee. The Director making the inquiry is an experienced and highly respected attorney.

His question was: "What is this Start Small. Think Big.?"

The Chairwoman inquired aloud, who reviewed this application? I raised my hand and all eyes turned to me in complete silence.

I described that Start Small. Think Big., Inc., provides legal services to small businesses in the five boroughs and is based in the South Bronx. I described legal services provided to about 900 unique entrepreneurs and small business owners throughout the city. The services run the gamut from help in choosing the right entity, protecting IP, contracts, employment, leasing and risk management, among many others. I described its funding as not predominately from government, but rather from fundraising and grants.

My fellow Directors listened quietly and intently with their full attention. No thumb typing or shuffling papers.

The feeling of accomplishment

We voted. It was unanimous. My recommendation was followed. We granted \$10,000 to Start Small. Think Big., Inc. I felt good about the outcome and I had confidence that we had made the correct decision to grant precious funds. We carefully applied our criteria to determine need. I studied that application and I scoured it for holes or inaccuracy. I was circumspect in my analysis. I believed what I read and I had confidence in the opportunities we could create. Yet I did not have empirical evidence in hand that the funding would actually work.

A year passed and this fall the big box of grant applications again arrived at my firm. I tore into it and found an application from Start Small. Think Big., Inc. An excerpt of the results is featured in this report.

Our grant of funds, previously donated to The Foundation, had made a difference.

As a result of the legal services provided, the products of one client are now sold in 11 stores, one in Chicago, and others in the South and on the West Coast. The stores employ many people.

The mission of The Foundation is compelling. The medical profession long ago dignified the "giving back" component in the practice of medicine. Lawyers can do it too. Organizations like Start Small. Think Big, Inc., provide an often unknown or unnoticed venue for lawyers to demonstrate the best aspects of our professional service - helping people.

"The number of hours and time that the Grant Review Committee puts into reviewing the applications is testimony to their passion to making a difference. To be able to hear how the grants impact these organizations and the people within our communities is heartwarming and supports the good work of The Foundation. I thank everyone for their commitment and efforts to this process."

Foundation Assists Courts, Administering Cy Pres Funds to Benefit Charitable Aims

The New York Bar Foundation has been entrusted by federal courts to receive distributions of cv pres or residual funds in class action cases and other settlements. The Foundation applies the residual funds as grant awards to support charitable or educational projects. Upon request, the Foundation also provides monitoring and accountability services to the Court.

2014 brought one of the largest settlements to The Foundation through the distribution of a \$2.3 million settlement as part of the Charron, et al. v. Pinnacle Group NY LLC, et. al., case as part of a court order from the Honorable Colleen McMahon, United States District Judge for the Southern District of New York.

The cy pres funds are being disbursed by The Foundation to two grantees, The Legal Aid Society and Legal Services NYC, as part of the court order for furtherance of the provision of tenant assistance and support in Pinnacle Buildings.


